## **Grants up to £2,000 that tackle food insecurity in Lewes District by building community capacity and contributing to a Good Food Movement for the district**

### **A Good Food Movement for Lewes District**

We believe that food poverty needs to be addressed with a whole-systems, circular approach that looks at a number of issues related to food insecurity not just access to food but food equality, food education & well-being, and sustainability.

We have two tranches of funding available to support residents experiencing food insecurity across the winter.

**Tranche One: running until the 30th of September 2023**

**Tranche Two: running until the 19th of February 2024**
